

SACRED HEART

IMITATING THE YES OF MARY

The Annunciation is the moment when our Lady is given to know the vocation which God planned for her from eternity. The annunciation to Mary and incarnation of the Word constitute the deepest mystery of the relationship between God and men and the most important event in the history of mankind. God becomes man and will remain so forever. Such is the extent of His goodness and mercy and love for all of us. And yet, on the day when the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity assumed frail human nature in the pure womb of the Blessed Virgin, it all happened quietly, without fanfare of any kind.

St. Luke tells the story in a very simple way. We should treasure these words of the Gospel and use them often, for example, practicing the Christian custom of saying the Angelus every day and reflecting on the five Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary.

As we come now to the final week of Advent, we are invited to consider Mary's example and inspiration. As the angel announced, the coming of the Messiah, who would establish the final reign of God, was to occur first in the life of Mary. Until the Lord comes again, the reign of God will continue to be established in a hidden way in the lives of those who, like Mary, consent to personally receive the announcement of the gospel, and through the power of the Holy Spirit, allow themselves to be a sort of throne or temple within which Jesus can take up residence.

In the First Reading, we heard about David, in spite of his personal and public life, wanting to build a temple for God. But instead of David building a temple (house) for God, God will build a "house," an everlasting dynasty for David.

The Gospel records the fulfilment of God's promise to David. Like the temple in Old Testament days, Mary was overshadowed by the power of the Most High and became his dwelling-place. The "shadow" is a symbol of the presence of God. When Israel was journeying through the wilderness, the glory of God filled the Tabernacle, and a cloud covered the Ark of the Covenant (Exodus 40:34-36). And when God gave Moses the tablets of the Law, a cloud covered Mount Sinai (Exodus 24:15-16); and, at the Transfiguration of Jesus the voice of God the Father was heard coming out of a cloud (Luke 9:35).

Like Mary, each of us is greeted by God, and called upon, first to conceive Christ in our hearts by faith and by obedience to the Word, to nurture with love the Christ-life within us, and then bring Him forth into the world around us, to make Him visible to the world through the Christlikeness of our way of life in what we say and in what we do.

Do we give consent for the Lord Jesus to dwell in our lives and exercise in us His kingly rule? As we do so, the kingdom of God is made that much firmer upon the earth. Let us pray today that, just as Mary's 'Yes' opened the door for the salvation of the world, a new door to deeper faith and commitment may be opened for us; and at the same time pray for those in our world who sit in darkness and unbelief. May Mary's faith, in God's Word and her obedience to what He asked of her, lead us to a similar act of faith and obedience, as we welcome Jesus into our lives this season of Christmas.

RESUMPTION OF WEEKLY PRAYER GROUPS

IN THE PARISH

Any of the Pious Prayer Groups in the Parish, who feel they are ready to begin prayer meetings again under the new restrictions guiding us for Masses, are now encouraged to do the following:

1. Each prayer group should appoint a safeguarding officer and a steward and submit the names and contact information to Fr. Victor.
2. Soon after meeting this request, prayer groups can begin their weekly prayers. For the sake of clarity, the following are the weekly prayer groups of our parish: The Legion of Mary, the Charismatic, the Divine Mercy group and Sacred Heart Association.
3. At all prayer meetings, the 2 meter social distancing must be observed, sanitise your hands before entering the Church and when leaving the Church. Face covering must be used except by those exempted due to health reasons. The steward should ensure everyone writes their names for Track and Trace. No group singing is allowed during prayers. However, a cantor or a soloist can sing and the organ or Piano is permitted. No passing of prayer books, each person should have his/hers. Physical contact with anyone is not permitted during prayers. The duration for prayer meeting is maximum of one hour. After the prayer meeting, the safeguarding officer for the group and the steward will ensure the pews are thoroughly cleaned with recommended anti bacterial wipes without bleach.
4. The UCM and St. Theresa's society are also permitted to meet only for prayers avoiding their usual meeting patterns. This way such meetings are permitted inside the Church. Both groups can alternate their meetings at the choir gallery. If they must proceed with this arrangement, please give us the names of your safeguarding officer/steward as requested for other societies.
5. Please note that cultural/social gatherings of communities within the parish are not permitted at this time.

Finally, as we all are aware, the coronavirus is still very much with us and restrictions are being tightened. We have to adapt to safety rules and learn to live with it. In the last two weeks, two parishes and their parish priests tested positive of the virus and have been shot down for two weeks. Let us remain careful and cautious as we create a safe environment for our collective worship. God bless you all.
